#### **REPORT OF THE COUNCIL**

The School entered its Jubilee Year on 14th January 1982 and prepared to celebrate fifty active and energetic years of Mesopotamian archaeology at a time when our programme of field work and publication has been as busy as at any time in the past.

Our Baghdad establishment saw a number of changes. Mr. J. N. Postgate resigned as Director of the British Archaeological Expedition to Iraq and returned to England to take up an appointment as Lecturer in the Ancient History and Archaeology of the Near East at the University of Cambridge from 1st January 1982.

As the new Director, in succession to Mr. Postgate, the Council appointed Dr. Michael Roaf who had held the position of Assistant Director since 1979 and has wide experience of field archaeology. To the vacated Assistant Directorship the Council appointed Dr. Jeremy Black, thereby ensuring that the School's epigraphic interests would be ably represented. Mr. Robert Killick was confirmed in his appointment as Secretary-Librarian for a further term and his wife Jane Moon was appointed Research Associate to the British Archaeological Expedition to Iraq in recognition of her valuable contribution to the School's work. These appointments left the Baghdad establishment with a capable and experienced team to tackle the expected demands of the forthcoming Eski Mosul rescue project.

At home, the Annual General Meeting was held on 25th November 1981. The death of Miss M. Munn Rankin in July 1981 deprived the Council of a long-standing supporter. Dr. R. D. Barnett, who had represented the Society of Antiquaries on the Council, presented his resignation. Mr. J. N. Postgate was elected to serve on the Council.

Following the Annual General Meeting, Mr. J. N. Postgate gave the lecture entitled "The Excavations at Abu Salabikh, 1981" in which he reported on the two seasons' field-work recorded below.

The Bonham Carter Memorial Lecture was given on 2nd June 1981 by Dr. P. R. S. Moorey, who asked: "Was there a Neo-Sumerian 'Royal Cemetry' at Ur?"

In Iraq, the Spring season of excavations at Abu Salabikh directed by Mr. J. N. Postgate ended on 27th May. Work included excavation on the Main Mound as well as extensive surface clearance on the Main Mound and on the West Mound. During the season Professor T. C. Young of the Royal Ontario Museum carried out an exploratory sondage on the Uruk Mound. A further short season in the Autumn lasted from 12th October to 14th November. During this season various tasks left over from the Spring were cleared up and a sondage in the West Mound revealed levels of the Uruk and Early Dynastic I periods.

The excavations at Qal'ah Island, 'Ana, as part of the Haditha Dam Salvage Project sponsored by the Iraqi State Organization for Antiquities and Heritage, which had been postponed from the Spring, started on 15th October and lasted until 25th January 1982. The work was directed by Dr. Michael Roaf and Mr Alastair Northedge. Here, occupation levels from the early first millennium B.C. to the Late Islamic period were investigated.

In November, the Third Symposium on Assur, Babylon and Haditha was held in Baghdad by the Iraqi State Organization for Antiquities and Heritage. A large number of British scholars came to Baghdad to participate in the Symposium, including Charles Burney, John Curtis, Oliver Gurney, Lady Mallowan, Terence Mitchell, David and Joan Oates, Trevor Watkins. During and after the Symposium proper, members were able to visit Babylon, Ctesiphon, Assur, Hatra and other sites near Mosul, and sites in the Haditha Dam Salvage Project.

During the past year, visitors to the Baghdad establishment included: Andrew Tomlinson, who was studying sealings in the Iraq Museum; Anthony Green (Fellow), who was studying Late Assyrian apotropaic figurines in the Iraq Museum; Lady Mallowan and Dr. Georgina Herrmann, who are preparing the ivories from the School's excavations at Nimrud for publication.

As ever, our warm thanks are due both to the State Organization for Antiquities and Heritage of Iraq and its President, Dr. Mu'ayyad Damerji, for their customary assistance and co-operation, and to the Council of the British Academy for their continued support.

# FIFTY YEARS OF MESOPOTAMIAN DISCOVERY

#### With an Introduction by Seton Lloyd

To celebrate its fiftieth anniversary (1932-1982) the British School of Archaeology in Iraq published in May 1982 a volume of essays, edited by John Curtis, on the various excavations which it has initiated or supported. There are articles on Nimrud, Tell al Rimah, Tell Taya, Abu Salabikh, the Hamrin sites, Umm Dabaghiyah, Choga Mami, Ras al 'Amiya, Chagar Bazar, Tell Brak, Arpachiyah, Balawat and Ain Sinu. Chapters have been written by Diana Kirkbride, David and Joan Oates, Nicholas Postgate, Julian Reade, Michael Roaf, David Stronach and John Curtis. The book, with a glossy card cover, has 123 pages, 88 black-and-white illustrations and 8 colour plates. In addition to containing much that was previously unpublished, it contains new insights into a variety of questions.
