

STUDENTSHIP

Applications are invited for a Studentship, tenable in 1947-1948, for work relating to the antiquities of Iraq or Syria, falling within one of the following descriptions:

- (a) Excavation.
- (b) Work in a museum for a catalogue or thesis or other special study.
- (c) Survey or examination of archaeological sites.
- (d) Recording of extant monuments.

Candidates must be between the ages of 21 and 35, and of British Nationality. Both sexes are eligible.

A candidate will not normally be elected if engaged in any other paid occupation, but the studentship may be held conjointly with other emoluments of a similar kind.

The stipend will not exceed £250, with £150 for travelling and other expenses if necessary.

The period of the Studentship will depend on the work proposed, but will not normally exceed one year.

TERMS OF MEMBERSHIP AND SUBSCRIPTION TO *IRAQ*

Ordinary Members of the School (including libraries, etc.) pay an annual subscription of one guinea or more. A man or woman may become a *Life Member* by a donation of £15.

Both Ordinary and Life Members are entitled to receive the Journal *Iraq* for an annual payment of ten shillings.

REPORT OF THE COUNCIL FOR 1945

The Council regret to record the death of Archbishop Lord Lang, a Vice-President, and of Sir Charles Marston, a Member of the Council. Sir Hugh Stonehewer-Bird, British Ambassador in Baghdad, has been elected a Vice-President. Lt-Gen. Sir James Marshall-Cornwall has been appointed representative of the Royal Geographical Society on the Council, Dr. R. B. Serjeant representative of the School of Oriental and African Studies, and Major Vyvyan Holt has been elected a Member of the Council.

Since the end of the year the Executive Committee have made a grant of £400 to Sir Leonard Woolley for his Atchana-Alalah expedition. Next year the School hopes, in co-operation with the Iraq Department of Antiquities, to engage in excavation in Iraq, and has made a grant of £2,500 to Mr. Mallowan for this purpose.

At the request of that Department the second report of its excavations at 'Aqar Quf was published as a supplement to the School's Journal. Publication of the Journal will be resumed during 1946.

The School has awarded a Fellowship of £400 to Dr. Gurney for the study of Assyriology and cuneiform; and has made a grant of £100 to Mrs. Mackay for her forthcoming book on Palmyra.

Particulars of a Studentship offered by the School will be found on the last page.

The accounts are submitted herewith. The Council recommend the transfer of £700 from the General Fund to the Endowment Fund.

The School is indebted to Professor Alan Gardiner for a gift of 20 books; and is again indebted to Mr. Harold Lakeman for auditing the accounts without fee.

Increased funds are needed to enable the School to carry out its objects. In co-operation with other British archaeological societies which carry on work abroad the School applied to the British Government for a grant, but the application was not successful. The Executive Committee appeal to those who ceased to subscribe during the war to renew their subscriptions, and they also ask for additional donations and bequests.
