

We regret to record the death of Admiral Sir Herbert Richmond, a member of the Council since the foundation of the School. Lady Drower, Sir Francis Humphrys and Mr. Michael Ionides have been elected members of the Council, and Professor Stuart Piggott has been appointed a member of it by Edinburgh University in succession to Professor Childe.

The Government of Iraq were unable to accept the proposal for an excavation by the Department of Antiquities and the School jointly, and suggested instead that Professor Mallowan should, with aid from the School, direct an excavation by the Department. This suggestion has since been withdrawn.

The School's application to the British Treasury for a grant has now been successful and £3,000 will be payable during the current year. This grant has enabled us to appoint a Director of the School in Iraq. Professor Mallowan has accepted the appointment and will spend the first four months of 1948 there.

Owing to printing difficulties the 1946 double issue of the School's Journal Iraq was not published until February, 1947. It consists of 160 pages, with 28 half-tone plates and a number of line illustrations. The contents include an article by Mrs. Maxwell-Hyslop on daggers and swords of Western Asia; the third interim report of the Government of Iraq's excavations at 'Aqar Quf; Mr. Mallowan's report on his excavations in the Balih Valley in 1938; articles on Mesopotamian chronology by Mr. M. B. Rowton and on Babylonian chess by Mr. Gadd.

The two 1947 issues will be devoted exclusively to Mr. Mallowan's pre-war excavations at Brak and Chagar Bazar, Syria. These had important results and yielded many fine objects, which will be fully illustrated.

Terms of subscription to the Journal will be found on the last page of this Report.

A grant of £250 has been made towards the cost of publishing Lady Drower's translation of the Sfar Malwasia (Book of the Zodiac) from the Mandaic; and a grant of £250 towards the cost of publishing the late Dr. Campbell Thompson's Dictionary of Assyrian Botany.

The accounts are annexed. The School is indebted to Mr. Harold Lakeman for auditing them without fee.
