REPORT OF THE COUNCIL

WE deeply regret to record the death of Air Chief Marshal Sir Robert Brooke-Popham, who was Chairman of the School from 1950 to 1954. He had studied archaeology all his life, and wherever he served abroad made himself acquainted with what had been done in that field. His interest in the archaeology of Iraq went back to his command there during 1928-30, when he followed keenly the work which was being done at Ur. While Chairman of the School he had the satisfaction of watching the discoveries made by the School's expeditions in Assyria.

A new Chairman has not yet been appointed. Mr. C. J. Edmonds, who for many years was one of the advisers to the Government of Iraq, has been appointed Vice-Chairman.

During the year 1953-4 the School suspended its activities in the field in order to concentrate on the publication of material obtained during five seasons after the war. Next year digging will perhaps begin again, both at Nimrud and on a smaller site

at which it may be less expensive.

In 1954 School Fellowships were held by Mrs. de Garis Davies and Mr. H. W. F. Saggs. Mrs. Davies went to Baghdad to make coloured reproductions of the best ivories, including the 'Monna Lisa' and the chryselephantine plaques. It is hoped that at least four plates in colour will appear in a forthcoming book. Mr. Saggs devoted six months to the examination of Assyrian documents discovered at Nimrud in 1952, the majority of which were letters addressed in the last quarter of the eighth century B.C. to the kings of Assyria by their governors, many of whom were in distant provinces of the empire. The publication of his work is likely to be of exceptional interest.

Our Secretary-Librarian, Miss Barbara Parker, has in part 1 of Volume XVI of Iraq given preliminary particulars of the business documents discovered during 1952. The Director wrote a full account of the fifth season's campaign (1953) for the same volume, and Dr. Gadd completed the description of a large inscribed prism of King Sargon. Other articles about the pottery were written by Miss Joan Lines and Mr. P. S. Rawson. Much of the Expedition's work has therefore been made known in a short time, and the School owes a debt to

many persons who have given their services for this purpose. It is unusual for an expedition to publish an account of the ancient literature simultaneously with a description of the material recovered by the dig.

The 1954 issues of Iraq are detailed on a separate sheet.

During the year the School gave hospitality in Baghdad to several distinguished persons. Lady Drower stayed for some weeks while continuing her work on the Mandaean scriptures. Professor Dorothy Garrod paid a visit, having come to Baghdad in order to examine material of the Stone Age in the Iraq Museum. Mr. and Mrs. D. McCown spent a short time at the School during the floods. We were also able to assist Mr. David Oates and Mr. Geoffrey Clark, who under the auspices of the British Academy had come to examine Roman remains and roads west of the Tigris, particularly in the Jebel Sinjar.

We congratulate our Director, Professor Mallowan, on his election as a fellow of the British Academy and as a member

of the Arab Academy.

As usual we are greatly indebted to Dr. Naji al Asil, the Director General of Antiquities, and his staff, who generously helped all these persons and provided facilities in the Iraq Museum for preparing a detailed account of the excavations. It is hoped that by the end of 1955 an illustrated volume entitled Nimrud and its Remains will complete this task.

The accounts are appended.
